

ABOUT THE COLLEGE



The college campus is spread over 40 bighas of land in the village Shubh Khera of Paonta Sahib about 1.5 kilometers away from Bus Stand. Note: The Principal has every right to make necessary changes and modifications in the committees from time to time as required.

ADMISSION RULES & ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

The Minimum qualification prescribed for admission to the courses and examination leading to the degree courses of the university qualifications shall be in accordance with the First Ordinance of HP University 1973 (clause 1.4 Chapter-1)

Any student who is seeking admission in the college in any Faculty / Course has to fulfill the following eligibility condition/Rules (clause 3.3A of Chapter III Vol.1) of the Ordinance of HP University.

A.Academic Qualification

BA-I- (Pass Course)

To be eligible for seeking admission to B.A.-1 (Pass Course) the candidate should have passed:

I)10 + 2 examination or an equivalent examination from any recognized Board/university established by law in India with 4 written subject (Including English) with at least 33% marks.

OR

II) Intermediate examination of Indian University / Board or any examination recognised equivalent therto (pass in four subject, one language and three other elective subject) with atleast 33% marks.

OR

III) For admission to BA-I with mathematics, either 45% marks in aggregate (with maths) or 45% in mathematics at 10+2 level, is eligible for admission to BA-I.

B.Com-I (Pass Course)

To be eligible for seeking admission to B.com-I (pass course) the candidate should have passed:

1)10+2 examination (commerce stream) with minimum 40% are eligible for admission in 1st year of the course.

OR

II) A student who has passed +2 or equivalent exams other than commerce stream in four written subjects (including English) with Economics or Mathematics as compulsory subject at +2 level with 45% marks is eligible for admission in 1st year of the course.

iii) For girl candidate the eligibility is pass percentage i.e. 33%

B.Sc. - I (Pass Course)

To be eligible for seeking admission to to B.Sc. - I (pass course) the candidate should have passed:

1) 10 + 2 examination or an equivalent examination (PCM/PCB) in science form a recognized Board / University established by law in India with five subject (including English) with at least 45% marks.

OR

II) Intermediate examination of an Indian University / Board or any examination (PCM/PCB) recognized equivalent thereto (pass in four subjects, one language and three other elective subjects) with minimum 45% marks) is eligible for admission to B.Sc-I

Remarks:

While determining percentage of marks for eligibility rounding off of fraction of 0.5 or above to the next full unit is permissible. A relaxation of 5% is available to SC/ST candidates for admission to B.Sc/B. Com 1st year.

B. Age Limit

For Admission to the year, of any course, a student must not be more that 23 years (25 years for girls) of age on 1st. July 2017 e.g. the applicant should not born earlier than 01-07-1994 in case of boys and 01-07-1992 in case of girls. However, in r/o SC and ST students a relaxation of 3 years is given.

The upper age limit in case of VIth semester and 3rd of the course is 24 and 25 years respectively with a relaxation of 3 years in case of students belonging to SC/ST women condidates.

The Vice-Chancellor of HPU Shimla has the power of permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months. All such cases could provisionally be granted age relaxation up to six monts by the Principal and a consolidated list of such cases be sent for approval of the Vice-Chanceller by 31st October of every Academic Year. A candidate who has availed age relaxation at the time of first admission shall be eligible for the same in the subsquent classes also.

Migration Rules

Migration from other colleges to this college and vice versa is governed by HP University rules. A migration certificate can be issued only if the student is registered with the HP University. A migrating student must submit following:

- 1. Lecture attendance statement in r/o all optional & compulsory subjects.
- 2. Statement of marks obtained in the House Examination in the previous college.
- 3. Character certificate from the principal of the College last attended.
- 4. The first college is entitled to receive the tuition fee for the month in which the University sanctions the migration. The second college is not entitled to receive the tuition fee for that month or part thereof.
- 5. A student disqualified by another University shall not be given admission during the period of disqualification.
- 6. The examination last taken by the candidate and the result thereof will be recorded on the migration certificate.
- 7. Specific mention will be made on the migration certificate if the candidate has been disqualified and whether the certificate is being issued during the period of his/her disqualification.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for Undergraduate (UG) Courses 2017 - 18 Academic Session

The Himanchal Pradesh University vide Letter No. 2-1/2012 - हि.प्र.चि.(क्रै) dated 4 June 2016 has been notified the acceptance of the latest course curriculum under Choice Based Credit system CBCS brought out by the University Grants Commission for implementation from the 2016-17 academic session.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System

- 1. Core Courses (C): 14 for honours courses; 4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A/B. Com.
- 2. Elective Course:
 - **2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** 4 honours courses and 2 each for regular courses. Elective courses offered under the main discipline / Subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.
 - 2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course: 4 for honours courses and 2 each for B.A/B.Com. Regular courses. An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/Subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to- as Generic Elective.
- 3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds:

SCHOLARSHIPS

A Number of scholarships are available for the eligible and deserving students. Information regarding dates, eligibility conditions and procedure for applying for these scholarships will be notified on the college notice board from time to time. The students may apply online for these scholarships.

STATE SPONSORED SCHOLARSHIP SCHEMES

- 1. IRDP Scholarship Scheme: the students who belong to IRDP families may apply for this scholarship with required documents. A sum of Rs. 1200/- per annum is provided as financial assistance.
- 2. Financial Assistance to the children of the armed Forces Personnel Killed/disabled during the different War/Operations: Children of armed forces personnel killed/disabled in the different wars/operations are eligible for this assistance. Application proformas are available with district Sainik welfare Board. A sum of Rs. 1200/- per annum is provided as financial assistance.
- 3. Indira Gandhi Utkrisht Chhatravritti Yojna for post plus two student:
 - The Indira Gandhi Utkrisht Chhatravritti Yojna for meritiorious students for the post plus two courses shall be awarded to 150 students @ Rs. 10,000/- p.a. per student purely on the basis of the merit and without any income ceiling. The Scholarship will also be awarded to ten toppers each from the merit list of 10+2 Arts, Science and Commerce, supplied by H.P Board of school Education Dharamshala, provided they join any academic/professional stream the scholarship will be renewed every year to the same number of students till they complete degree/course.
- **Kalpana Chawla Chhatravriti Yojna:** This is a state sponsored scheme started form the year 2012-13. Under this scheme the top 2000 meritorious girl student of 10+2 of all study groups i.e. Science, Arts and Commerce streams are awarded a scholarship of Rs. 15000/- per student p.a. based on passing ratio in each group as per the merit list supplied by HP Board of school Education Dharamshala. The scholarship will be renewed till the completion of Degree/Diploma/Certificate courses provided there is no failure.

CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHOLARSHIP SCHEMES

- 5. Post-Matriculation Scholarships For SC/ST Student: For students belongings to SC/ST category whose parents annual income does not exceed Rs. 2,50,000/-
- 6. Post-Matric Scholarship Scheme to OBC Students: The students belongings to OBC category are entitled for this scholarship if the annual income of their parents is up to Rs. 1,00,000/-
- 7. Maharishi Balmiki Chattarvriti Yojna: The scholarship under this scheme is @ Rs. 9000/- per year given to the Bonafide Himachali Girl students belonging to Balmiki Families, engaged in unclean occupation. The concerned student must apply on prescribed proforma through their head of the school/ college/instutution along with balmiki certificate.
- 8. Merit-cum-Means Scholarship for Students belonging to the Minority Community (Centrally Sponsored Scheme): The annual income of the parents/ guardians of the beneficiaries should not exceed Rs. 2.5 Lakhs form all sources and the student should not have secured less than 55% marks or equivalent grade in the previous final examination.
- **Post-Merit Scholarship Scheme for Students belonging to Minortiy Community (Centrally Sponsored Scheme):** The annual income of the parents/ guardians of the beneficiaries should not exceed Rs. 2 Lakh from all sources and the student should not have secured less than 50% marks or equivalent grade in the previous final examination. The students must have passed the examination from government/government-aided institutions.
- 10. Post Matric Scholarship for Students with Disabilities: This scheme is available to students with disabilities who are covered under the person with disabilities (Equal opportunity, protection of rights and full participation) act, 1995. Scholarship under the scheme will be awarded by the ministry of social justice & Empowerment, Department of disability affairs, Government of India. Scholarship will be paid to the students whose parents/Guardians income from all sources does not exceed Rs. 2,50,000/- per annum.

11. Scholarship for Children of Mine Workers: The scheme is sponsored by the Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India. Either of the parents of the students should be a beedi worker or a mine worker Iron Ore/Manganese Ore/Chrome Orc mines, Limestone/ Dolomite or Mica Mines or a cine worker for six months at least, This would also include contract laborers. Total Income of both the parents of the students from all sources should not exceed 10,000 P.M. including all allowance. The scholarship under this scheme is Rs. 3000/- per year.

INDIVIDUAL-SPONSORED SCHOLARSHIPS

Chaudhary Sher Jung Memorial Scholarship: This Scholarship of Rs. 2000/- per student (One girl and one boy student) from each faculty of Arts, Commerce and Science is given to meritorious student coming from economically weaker families to encourage them.

FEE CONCESSION

Half Fee Concession: One of the two or more real brother/sister studying in the lower class in the college will be eligible for 50% exemption in tuition fee.

Tuition Fee Concession: Himachali Bonafide Girls and Physically Challenged with a disability of more than 40%

DISCIPLINE AND CONDUCT

The Principal & members of the staff have power to take disciplinary action against student indulging in acts of indiscipline which may lead to fine, suspension, rustication or expulsion.

RAGGING

A. Rules and Regulation & Loss of Books & fine

Identity card and library card should be collected from the librarian as per the schedule notified by the librarian. A student must bring his/her library card to get the books issued in his / her name. Only two books are issued to a student at a time for a period of 14days. Reference Books / Dictionaries / news paper Periodicals will not be issued.

If the issued books are not returned by due date, a fine at Re 1.00 per book per day will charged. In case of loss of book, The student will have to replace the book with new one or pay actual price of the book plus 20% of the original prices as a fine amount.

Books returned in damaged condition will entail penalty as per rules. Failure to return the book or to pay the penalty imposed will entail the same procedure for recovery as in the case of recovery of Govt. property, i.e., through the police or Deputy Commissioner.

B. Loss of Library Card

In case of loss of the library card, a duplicate card can be had at Rs.50.00

C. No Dues Certificate & Refund of Library Security

All the issued books must be returned and library card be surrendered to the librarian before the annual examination. A No Dues Certificate to this effect should be obtained from the librarian otherwise Roll No. slip will not be issued.

All the student can claim the refund of their library security within one year of leaving the college even if they leave the college without completing their course of study otherwise the security will stand lapsed.

Leave Rule

- 1. Students should get their leave application recommended by the teachers.
- 2. Leave up to 3 days will be sanctioned by the tutors.
- 3. Leave for more than three days will be sanctioned by the Principal
- 4. The Students will be marked absent during the leave period and the same will not be considered for calculating the lectures attended by him/her for determining his/her eligibility to appear in the University Examination, However in case leave is properly sanctioned, neither his/her name will be struck off the rolls, nor any absence fine will be imposed.

Re-Admission

- 1. The Student absent for 5 days continuously from any class without proper sanctioning of leave by the concerned authority/principal, his/her name automatically will be struck off from the rolls.
- 2. Readmission will be entertained on payment of readmission fee of Rs. 100/- within 7 days. After duly permitted by the principal after expiry of 7 days the student shall have to bear readmission fee of 200/-. In addition to it, the principal may impose extra fine depending upon the gravity of his/her absence.
- 3. A student struck off for the second time in session from any class will be ineligible for readmission to the class, but in exceptional cases, the Principal may grant special permission using his discretionary powers if he/she deems

Co-Curricular and Extra - Curricular Activities

Education is a very broad term and goes beyond the training of one's mind for acquiring textual knowledge. It is associated with other activities in order to see multi dimensional development of overall personality of a man. The college provides opportunity to our students through many co-curricular and other activities that help them to develop into a sound body and mind. Keeping this in view we have societies like Science Society, Social Science Society, Read Ribbon Club and Eco Club etc. Students are encouraged to join these societies as per their interest. National Service Scheme (NSS)

The college has two NSS units. Enrolment in NSS is done in the beginning of the section in the month of July. Students have to apply as and when notified through notice board for enrolment in NSS.

Rover and Rangers

The college has got one unit of Rovers and Rangers each. Basically it is voluntary non-political youth organization wherein students are trained to combat during natural disaster and otherwise too. It helps its members to have all round development and become perfect responsible individuals to the society, nation and the world at large.

Mentor Cell

The Students are encouraged to interact with their teachers regarding their problems which may be academic, non-academic or personal. Appropriate help and guidance is provided to cater the needs of students. It is also an essential and integral part of IQAC.

College Students Central Association (CSCA)

The college student central association is formed every year as per the rules laid down by Himanchal Pradesh University, Shimla from time to time. Presently the selection for various post of this association is done through merit i.e indirect selection mode.

Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

To encourage community participation in education Parent Teacher Association (PTA) under section 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the HP Education code, 2001, has been established. It is a non - political body for better co-ordination and interaction between parents and teachers for improvement of academic standards and infra-strucural facilities of the college.

IGNOU

IGNOU Study Centre - 1133 G.C. Paonta Sahib is running various educational and vocational programmes. All IGNOU courses are recognised by the Govt of India & by the UGC. The college students can simultaneously do any of the degree or diploma programmes from IGNOU. The additional professional courses under walk-in admission can be done throughout the year in July or January session. No migration and no age limit is required for IGNOU courses.

Self-Financing Courses

Other than routine traditional faculties of Science, Humanities and Commerce the college has thrown open other important courses including BCA and PGDCA to cater to the needs of technologically fast growing society. These self-financing courses are under control of the college level Higher Education Institute Society (Regd.). Presently 50 seats (25 subsidised & 25 Non-subsidised) are there in BCA and PGDCA each.

Community College:

The college offers UGC sponsored Advance Diploma in Food Processing and Advance Diploma in Pharmaceuticals under Community College Scheme. Each Diploma has 50 seats. Eligibility with +2 in any stream no age limit is required. Scholarship to every student @ Rs. 6000/- per semester. These courses provide career opportunities of self employment and placement in the industrial sector. The aim of the community college is "Be skilled, Be independent."

PAHAL: The Cultural Function

Preservation of cultural heritage gives strength to the society. The society in turn nurtures cultural programs with gusto. Keeping in view the importance of cultural function college celebrates—cultural festival in the form of a programme called PAHAL with great excitement. This forum provides a platform to students to exhibit their keenness in cultural activities like dancing, singing and various other genres. During this function Student prepare cultural activities like dancing singing and various other genres. During this function students prepare cultural items and a days long celebration takes place.

Sports

In order to encourage students our college provides facilities for indoor and outdoor games. College is housed with a very big playground where cricket, volleyball, basketball, and badminton courts are well designed. We have facilities for indoor games like carom, Chess, and table tennis too. Students are encouraged to participate in any of the game and prepare for inter-college tournaments organized by Himachal Pradesh University to earn name and fame and establish oneself in sports also.

BHANUJA: Yearly Periodical

In Order to encourage creative abilities among the students, the college magazine Bhanuja is published annually. It consists of a number of sections and each section has one staff editor & one student editor, students are asked to contribute original authored poems, article, stories, memories, experiences and so on giving it a literary tinge. It also exhibits a panoramic summary of year long activities in form of pictography.

Educational Tours

For the Overall development of the students stream-wise educational tours are arranged from time to time. The purpose of the trip is usually observation, non-experimental research or to provide students with experiences outside their everyday activities, such as going & camping with teachers and their classmates. The aim of this research is to observe the subject in natural state and possible collect sample. The college organizes / sponsors the following tour each year.

- 1. All India tour (Duration 10-15 days approximately) during the winter vacation.
- 2. Short tour (2-3 days)
- One day trip.

* Tour unaccompanied by at least one member of the teaching staff will not be permitted.

The student desirous of participating in such tours should seek the permission of the principal after getting the written consent of the teacher who has agreed to accompany the tour. Adequate publicity and time must be given to sanction tour to enable maximum number of student to participate in such tour.

* The teacher will be required to complete the codal formalities and other formalities like arrangement of buses, accommodation etc. related to the tour.

- The student will be allowed to join the tour only on production of written consent from the parent.
- * No student shall be permitted to participate in more than one short tour

No outsider will be permitted to join the tour

All students will carry their identity cards with them on all such tours.

The student will be expected to maintain complete discilpline on the tour. Any act of indiscipline reported by the teacher in-charge may entail severe penalty.

Caution: Parents are advised to ascertain that the tour is authorised by college before issuing the permission letter to their ward.

In case, some seats remain vacant or fall vacant subsequently, the same will be filled after calling the candidates in order of merit, only out of the list of the candidates who have been interviewed earlier and were eligible (having passed the qualifying examination on the date of interview).

- 10. Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

Further, such cases will be reported to the police and dealt as per Himanchal Pradesh Education Institution (Prohibition of Ragging) bill 2009 According to which ragging has been made a cognizable, non-bailable offence compound with the permission of the court. Any student convicted of an offence will be punished with the imprisonment upto 3 year or fine of up Rs. 50,000 or both.
