

1.1 Lecture Method







Mitochondria - The Powerhouse of the Cell

Mitochondria are known as the "powerhouses" of the cell because they generate most of the energy in the form of adenosine triphosphate (ATP). These organelles are found in almost all eukaryotic cells and are vital for many cellular processes.

Discovery of Mitochondria:
Mitochondria were first observed by Richard Altmann in 1890 and were later named by Carl Benda in 1898. The term "mitochondrion" comes from the Greek words "mitos" meaning thread and "chondrion" meaning granule.

Key Functions of Mitochondria:



1. **ATP Production:** Through the process of cellular respiration, mitochondria convert glucose and oxygen into energy (ATP).
2. **Regulation of Cellular Metabolism:** They help control the metabolic activities of the cell.
3. **Calcium Storage:** Mitochondria store calcium ions, which are important for cell signalling.
4. **Apoptosis:** They play a role in programmed cell death (apoptosis), helping remove damaged cells.
5. **Heat Production:** In brown fat cells, mitochondria help generate heat through a process called non-shivering thermogenesis.
6. **Synthesis of Certain Hormones:** Mitochondria are involved in the synthesis of some steroid hormones.

Structure of Mitochondria:

- Mitochondria are double-membrane bound organelles.
- The outer membrane is smooth and permeable to small molecules.
- The inner membrane is highly folded into structures known as cristae.

Classroom time is then utilized for in-depth discussions, collaborative problem-solving, and hands-on activities that reinforce and extend understanding.

This approach transforms the classroom into an interactive learning environment where students actively engage with the subject matter rather than passively receive information. Faculty members act as facilitators, guiding learners through practical exercises, case studies, and group projects that enhance comprehension and application of theoretical concepts.

At SGGSJ Government College, the flipped classroom method has been particularly effective in subjects that require analytical reasoning and application-based learning. By allowing students to explore topics independently before class, this method cultivates self-discipline, accountability, and critical thinking. Furthermore, the interactive classroom sessions promote peer learning, communication skills, and deeper conceptual clarity.

Through the adoption of the flipped classroom model, the college continues to strengthen its commitment to experiential and participatory learning, preparing students to adapt to diverse academic and professional contexts with confidence and competence.



1.3 (a) Field Visit by Department of Zoology


Educational Tour Report: Fish Farming Exposure for B.Sc Zoology Students

The Department of Zoology at SGGSI Govt. College Paonta Sahib organized an enriching educational tour for B.Sc. 3rd-year students to enhance their practical understanding of fish farming. The tour was conducted in two phases: a physical visit and a virtual session.

In the first phase, 15 students accompanied by Dr. Ritu Pant and Ms. Sulakshana Sharma visited the Fish Farm at Badripurr, Paonta Sahib on 6th September 2024. This farm, spread across 24 acres, is managed by the Department of Fish and Fisheries and cultivates species such as Common Carp, Silver Carp, Grass Carp, Rohu, and Mrigal. Students observed breeding techniques using specialized hapas and learned about farm management practices.

The second phase involved a virtual tour of the Trout Fish Farm at Nohardhar, conducted via Google Meet with Ms. Samapi, a fish culturist. This farm, located in a cold-water region, specializes in trout fish culture, offering insights into temperature-specific aquaculture.

The tour provided students with hands-on exposure to fish breeding, species diversity, and aquaculture techniques. It successfully bridged theoretical learning with field experience, fostering entrepreneurial interest and deeper understanding of fish culture. Overall, the initiative proved highly informative and beneficial for aspiring zoologists.



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

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

1.2(iv) Internal Assessment Mechanism

As per the guidelines of the affiliating Himachal Pradesh University Shimla, internal assessment is based on student's attendance, writing skills (assignments), presentation skills (seminar) and knowledge levels (internal/Mid Term Examination). The major component in Continuous Comprehensive Assessment system at the institutional level is mid-term examination. In order to ensure transparency in internal examinations, the date sheet is notified at the college level and in accordance with the date sheet, internal examinations are conducted. The question papers are prepared by teachers in charge by giving careful consideration of syllabus prescribed and questions papers are set keeping in view the 75 percent syllabus coverage. The evaluated answer sheets are shared with the students for peer discussion and classroom analysis. Thus, a proper analysis of each internal exam helps them to become better learners. The college observes complete transparency in the award of internal assessment based on the performance of the students by displaying it on the notice board and website. Each student is required to validate its acceptance by signing the award list within the notified time after which his acceptance is deemed understood. The students can also address their grievances concerning CCA marks if any through Grievance Redressal Application Form available. The students who fail to earn the minimum passing awards in internal assessment are given a chance to resubmit their assignments.

The teachers also conduct seminars and presentations in the class as part of Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) which provide the students a explicatory platform to the students.



1.3 Add-On Course/Certificate Courses.



Percentage of Student satisfaction: The **82.31 %** positive response rate from the student satisfaction survey reflects a strong overall experience among students. The feedback highlights the effectiveness of the college's academic programs and faculty support while identifying key areas for improvement. By addressing the concerns raised and implementing the recommended strategies, the college can continue to enhance the student experience and foster a positive learning environment. Regular assessments of student satisfaction will ensure ongoing improvement and alignment with students'

needs and expectations. The online curriculum feedback from all stakeholders was collected through online Google forms. The feedback was analysed, and recommendations were made by the IQAC. Collecting student feedback is essential for understanding their learning experiences, identifying areas for improvement, and ensuring continuous enhancement of academic and support services. Utilizing online Google Forms for gathering feedback offers a convenient and efficient way to collect, analyse, and act on student opinions. The primary objectives of collecting student feedback are 1) to assess the quality of teaching and learning experiences. 2) to gauge student satisfaction with the course content, delivery, and support services. 3) to identify areas for improvement and potential adjustments to the curriculum or teaching methods. Google Forms was chosen for its accessibility, ease of use, and capability to compile data automatically for analysis. A link to the Google Form was shared with students via email and WhatsApp groups. The form included a mix of multiple-choice, rating scale, and open-ended questions covering aspects such as course content, teaching effectiveness, learning resources, and overall satisfaction. To encourage honest and candid responses, the feedback form was designed to be anonymous, ensuring student privacy. Key Areas of Feedback are course content, teaching effectiveness, learning resources and support and overall satisfactions and recommendations. The majority of respondents were satisfied with their academic experience, though there were requests for more opportunities for group discussions and collaborative projects. Google Forms is user-friendly and requires minimal technical skills, both for creators and respondents. Responses are collected in real-time and automatically compiled into a Google Sheet, making it easy to organize and analyse feedback. Students can complete the form on any device with internet access, increasing response rates and accessibility. Google Forms is a free tool, making it a cost-effective option for collecting feedback. Collecting student feedback through Google Forms has proven to be an efficient and effective method for understanding student experiences and identifying areas for improvement. By analysing the feedback, the institution can make data-driven decisions to enhance the quality of education and ensure a positive and supportive learning environment. Regular feedback collection, combined with timely implementation of improvements, will continue to foster a culture of continuous improvement and student satisfaction.



(iii) Students Suggestions and Doable Actions Taken

1. Artificial Intelligence

Industry 4.0 technologies have been sent to higher authority and industry collaborations. One day workshop on “A.I. and Full Stack Development” was organised by Department BCA, PGDCA and MBA in collaboration with IQAC and ALPHA TECHNOLOGIES Mohali on 24th July 2025.



2. Games and Physical Education

Students' trails are conducted by the different committees of the college for selection of teams in the various H.P.U. inter-college tournaments. At the college level, the students are encouraged to participate in the various college level sports events such as Intra-Mural Tournaments and Annual Sports Meet. In addition to that Physical Education Department provides sports articles for students' practices round the year.

3. Mental health and stress management

Mentor-Mentee Sessions: College is conducting the mentor-mentee sessions to guide younger students through problem-solving techniques and emotional regulation strategies.

4. Practical Life Skills

College is improving the practical solving skills of students in the following ways:

Classroom Challenges: Dividing the students into groups and presenting them with real-world problems that require innovative solutions.

Hackathons: Organize a hackathon where students work in teams to come up with creative technological solutions to social or environmental issues.

Experiments and Labs: For subjects like science and engineering, hands-on experiments allow students to test hypotheses, face challenges, and find solutions through trial and error.

Inquiry-Based Learning: Encourage students to ask questions, investigate, and develop solutions on their own or in groups. Instead of providing answers, guide them toward resources or approaches that will help them figure things out.

Project-Based Learning: Assigning projects where students must research, plan, and solve a problem over time. This allows them to delve deeply into a subject and develop independent problem-solving skills.

Organization of Workshop: In order to provide skills to the students, a one week Hybrid Mode State Level Workshop on “Applications of GIS” was organised by the Department of Geography in collaboration with IQAC from 1st to 7th November, 2025.


