3.1 Classrooms well maintained:



NCC ENROLLMENT 2024-25

6 Aug 2024

REPORT

The enrolment process of NCC (SW) in SGGSJ Government College Paonta Sahib was conducted on 6th August 2024 under the supervision of two Permanent Instructors from 1 HP (G) Battalion, Solan. The enrollment process was well-structured, with a focus on evaluating candidates based on general awareness, physical fitness, stamina, and other relevant criteria. About 28 candidates applied for the test out of which only 14 were selected.

Written Test on General Awareness

The day began with a written test designed to assess the general awareness of the candidates. The test comprised a variety of questions, ranging from current events, general knowledge, and basic military-related information, to ensure that candidates possessed the necessary cognitive skills for NCC training.

The candidates were given 30 minutes to complete the test, and their performance was meticulously evaluated. The results of this written test played a crucial role in determining the overall merit of the candidates.

Ground Trials: Stamina and Physical Fitness

After the written test, the focus shifted to ground trials where candidates were tested on their stamina and physical fitness. These trials were conducted by the two Permanent Instructors from the 1 HP (G) Battalion, Solan. The trials included running exercises, push-ups, sit-ups, and other endurance-based tasks to ensure that candidates met the physical standards required for NCC training.

The instructors provided guidance throughout the trials, motivating the candidates to give their best performance. Each candidate's time and performance in the stamina trials were carefully recorded and assessed.

Height and Weight Measurement

Alongside the ground trials, the height and weight of each candidate were measured. These measurements were essential for ensuring that the candidates met the physical criteria for the NCC enrollment. The instructors cross-checked the measurements with the standard NCC requirements to ensure eligibility.

Merit-Based Selection

Once all assessments were completed, a merit list was compiled. This merit list was based on the combined scores of the written test, ground trials, and physical measurements. Candidates who excelled in both mental and physical evaluations were shortlisted for final enrollment into the NCC program at the college.

The event concluded successfully, with the Permanent Instructors praising the candidates for their effort and dedication throughout the process. The selected candidates were congratulated and briefed on the next steps for their NCC training.

Conclusion

The NCC enrollment drive on 6th August 2024 was a well-coordinated event that ensured a rigorous selection process. The involvement of the Permanent Instructors from 1 HP (G) Battalion, Solan, added credibility and professionalism to the proceedings. The candidates' performance in general awareness and physical fitness trials was commendable, and the selection process ensured that only the best-suited individuals were chosen for the NCC training.

This successful event not only provided the selected candidates with an opportunity to be a part of the prestigious NCC but also reinforced the college's commitment to fostering discipline, leadership, and national service among its students.



